REVIEW OF NOVEMBER MEETING – ART COOPERATIVES

Leading members of our three key local cooperatives came along to give us an insight into the groups, and running them. First up was Sue Martin of Appledore Crafts Company. Sue is a fused glass artist and is in fact a member of all three of the cooperatives. The Appledore group has been running the longest (over 10 years) and had the biggest reputation in the area – all cooperatives have members (who man the gallery on a regular basis) and sale or return exhibitors, often with single artist gallery shows alongside. Helen Bailes described her career as a ceramicist and how this had led to taking space in the Torrington pannier market, finally evolving into the cooperative gallery we see today (14 The Gallery). 14 The Gallery had received funding from Women and Micro-enterprise (WAM) and also received a business award from the group. Alison Nicholson is a leading local textile artist and the driving force behind The Art Coop. Alison talked about The Art Coop (in Bear Street in Barnstaple) – its evolution had been different again, with the cooperative taking over an existing gallery at a local framers. This gallery was the newest of the three (started in 2009) and has introduced solo showcases, book signings, etc, regular press stories, to increase gallery traffic. THE FOYLE FOUNDATION GRANTS

It now operates a Small Grants Scheme, and a Main Grants Scheme which supports registered charities whose core work covers Arts and Learning.

The Small Grants Scheme offers grants of £1,000 - £10,000, over one year, to smaller charities working at grass roots level across a range of activities. The key priorities for the Main Grants Scheme for the Arts are making the arts more accessible, encouraging new work/artists and building/infrastructure projects to construct or improve arts facilities. Community arts activity will not generally be supported.

The Main Grants Scheme for Learning supports projects which help with knowledge acquisition and which have a long-term strategic impact. Key priorities for the voluntary sector are libraries, museums and archives and special educational needs and learning difficulties. Past grants are in the region of £10,000 - £250,000.

QEST was established in 1990 to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the Royal Warrant Holders Association and the 90th birthday of Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother. There is no age limit.
